

PHYSICAL THERAPY

Physical therapists are health care professionals who help individuals maintain, restore, and improve movement, activity, and functioning, thereby enabling optimal performance and enhancing health, well-being, and quality of life. Their services prevent, minimize, or eliminate impairments of body functions and structures, activity limitations, and participation restrictions. Physical therapy is provided for individuals of all ages who have or may develop impairments, activity limitations, and participation restrictions related to conditions of the musculoskeletal, neuromuscular, cardiovascular, pulmonary, and/or integumentary systems or environment related injuries.

Physical therapists play vital roles in today's health care environment and are recognized as essential providers of rehabilitation performance enhancement, and prevention and risk-reduction services. Physical therapists also play important roles both in developing standards for physical therapist practice and in developing health care policy to ensure availability, accessibility, and optimal provision of physical therapy.

The scope of practice for physical therapists is dynamic, evolving with evidence, education, and societal needs, and has 3 components:



For continues assessment of students regarding their course, a series of 3 continues assessment tests (CATS) will be conducted by SIMAS. Which will start from third week of 1st month. By the end of course work, internal evaluation will be made from their CAT results. 20% of internal evaluation marks count in semester.

RULES & REGULATION OF SEMESTER EXAMINATIONS SHALL BE FOLLOWED TO THE POLICY OF DOW:

- Minimum attendance 75% attendance for eligibility to appear in the semester examination.
- If Minimum attendance is not maintained by the students as approved by the Sindh Institute of Medical & Allied Sciences his / her examination form shall not be forwarded to the Controller of Examinations (UG) of DOW University of Health Sciences, Karachi.
- Mid Term Examination will be conducted after six (06) weeks and each student has to obtain minimum 70% marks positively in each.




LIBRARY
